I. CALL TO ORDER

Mark Stenglein, chair, called the meeting to order at 4:35 p.m. in Conference Room C-2350 in the Hennepin County Government Center.

II. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Upon a motion by Barret Lane and seconded by Holliar Tyner the agenda was adopted.

III. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

Upon a motion by Nicholas Kakos and seconded by Jeffrey Strand the minutes of the June 18, 2001 meeting were adopted.

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IV. PRESENTATION

1. Funding Issues Resulting from the 2001 Tax Bill

On July 9, 2001 a joint meeting of the Ways & Means/Budget and Community Development Committees of the City Council was held. At that meeting a presentation was made to inform committee members and the public of the implications for Minneapolis and the NRP of the adopted 2001 Tax Bill. At this meeting (July 23, 2001) of the Policy Board a similar presentation was made by representatives of the City.

Patrick Born, City Finance Officer, focused his presentation on what the legislature did in the tax bill, what it means for Minneapolis taxpayers, and what the impact will be on City finances and community development. Steve Cramer, Executive Director of the Minneapolis Community Development Agency, then presented a more detailed review of the issues confronting MCDA and NRP because of this legislative change. The presentation concluded with Kathleen O'Brien, City Coordinator, outlining the steps that the NRP Community Development Work Team will be taking to identify strategies that address the City's community development needs.

V. ACTION ITEMS

1. Moratorium on Phase II Funding Requests

[NRP / PR#2001-11]

Given the uncertain funding for Phase II, Bob Miller presented to the Policy Board a recommendation to suspend the commitment of any and all future Phase II funds until such time as the source and amount of the funds to support Phase II are identified and approved by the board. He then presented the current status of NRP funds and based upon that status suggested that it was appropriate to proceed with Participation Agreements that have already been approved using the Plan Development Advance Fund approved by the Board last November. After considerable discussion, a consensus was reached to suspend expenditures from this fund as well.

Peter McLaughlin moved and Sharon Sayles Belton seconded the suggested resolution and then Peter McLaughlin moved and Joe Mullery seconded to amend by deleting the proposed third and fourth clauses and substituting a new third clause. To address concern that some emergency funding may be needed to support a neighborhood organization while future funding is being determined, Diane Hofstede moved and Barret Lane seconded to amend by adding a new fourth clause. The following is the complete resolution as amended and adopted.

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RESOLVED: That the Minneapolis Neighborhood Revitalization Policy Board (Board) hereby suspends the commitment of any and all future Phase II NRP funds until such time as the source and amount of the funds to support Phase II are identified and approved by the Board; and,

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the projects submitted in response to the first Affordable Housing Reserve Fund RFP be retained, unopened and unevaluated, until such time as the Board determines that sufficient funds have been identified for Phase II neighborhood allocations and the Reserve Funds for Affordable Housing and Commercial Area Development; and,

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Director propose an interim plan for funding and implementing planning activity based on the need for continuity and projected limitations in resources.

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Director is authorized to expend up to \$10,000 to financially assist any neighborhood with pre Phase II planning activity until an interim plan for funding and implementing is adopted.

2. Whittier Neighborhood Phase II Participation Agreement

Given the previous action of the Board and the lateness of the meeting, Nicholas Kakos moved and Holliar Tyner seconded to table action on the Whittier Neighborhood Phase II Participation Agreement. The motion carried.

VI. POLICY ITEM

1. 2001 Neighborhood Representative Election

Upon a motion by Albert Gallmon and seconded by Denise Stephens the following resolution was adopted.

RESOLVED: That the Minneapolis Neighborhood Revitalization Policy Board adopts the following schedule for the 2001 Election of Neighborhood Representatives and Alternates to the Policy Board.
